For your loving-kindness is better than life itself; \* my lips shall give you praise. So will I bless you as long as I live \* and lift up my hands in your Name. My soul is content, as with marrow and fatness, \* and my mouth praises you with joyful lips, <sup>6</sup> When I remember you upon my bed, \* and meditate on you in the night watches. <sup>7</sup> For you have been my helper, \* and under the shadow of your wings I will rejoice. 8 My soul clings to you; \* your right hand holds me fast. 9 May those who seek my life to destroy it \* go down into the depths of the earth; <sup>10</sup> Let them fall upon the edge of the sword, \* and let them be food for jackals. But the king will rejoice in God; all those who swear by him will be glad; \* for the mouth of those who speak lies shall be stopped. Psalm 98 Cantate Domino <sup>1</sup> Sing to the LORD a new song, \* for he has done marvelous things. With his right hand and his holy arm \* has he won for himself the victory. The LORD has made known his victory; \* his righteousness has he openly shown in the sight of the nations. <sup>4</sup> He remembers his mercy and faithfulness to the house of Israel, \* and all the ends of the earth have seen the victory of our God. 5 Shout with joy to the LORD, all you lands; \* lift up your voice, rejoice, and sing. <sup>6</sup> Sing to the LORD with the harp, \* with the harp and the voice of song. With trumpets and the sound of the horn \* shout with joy before the King, the LORD. 8 Let the sea make a noise and all that is in it, \* the lands and those who dwell therein. 9 Let the rivers clap their hands, \* and let the hills ring out with joy before the LORD, when he comes to judge the earth.

10 In righteousness shall he judge the world \*

and the peoples with equity.

#### The Lessons

#### A reading from Deuteronomy 8:1-10

This entire commandment that I command you today you must diligently observe, so that you may live and increase, and go in and occupy the land that the LORD promised on oath to your ancestors. Remember the long way that the LORD your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, in order to humble you, testing you to know what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep his commandments. He humbled you by letting you hunger, then by feeding you with manna, with which neither you nor your ancestors were acquainted, in order to make you understand that one does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD. The clothes on your back did not wear out and your feet did not swell these forty years. Know then in your heart that as a parent disciplines a child so the LORD your God disciplines you.

Therefore keep the commandments of the LORD your God, by walking in his ways and by fearing him. For the LORD your God is bringing you into a good land, a land with flowing streams, with springs and underground waters welling up in valleys and hills, a land of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive trees and honey, a land where you may eat bread without scarcity, where you will lack nothing, a land whose stones are iron and from whose hills you may mine copper. You shall eat your fill and bless the LORD your God for the good land that he has given you.

#### Song of Penitence

O Lord and Ruler of/the hosts of heaven, **God of Abraham, Isaac, and Ja-cob,** and of all their righteous off-spring: **You made the heavens and the earth.** 

with all their vast array.

All things quake with fear at your presence;
they tremble because of your power.

But your merciful promise is be-yond all measure;

it sur-passes all that our minds can fathom.

O Lord, you are full of compassion,
long-suffering, and abounding in mercy.

You hold back your hand;

You do not punish as we de-serve.

In your great goodness, Lord,
you have promised for-give-ness to sinners,
that they may repent of their sin and be saved.

For you, O Lord, are the God of those who repent, and in me you will show forth your goodness. Unworthy as I am, you will save me, in accordance with your great mercy,

and I will praise you without ceasing all the days of my life.
For all the powers of heaven sing your praise, and yours is the glory to ages of age.

Amen.

#### A reading from 1 Corinthians 1:17-31

For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power. For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart." Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world?

For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, so that no one might boast in the presence of God. He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, in order that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

Here ends the Reading.

#### A reading from Mark 2:18-22

Now John's disciples and the Pharisees were fasting; and people came and said to him, "Why do John's disciples and the disciples of the Pharisees fast, but your disciples do not fast?" Jesus said to them, "The wedding guests cannot fast while the bridegroom is with them, can they? As long as they have the bridegroom with them, they cannot fast. The days will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them, and then they will fast on that day. "No one sews a piece of unshrunk cloth on an old cloak; otherwise, the patch pulls away from it, the new from the old, and a worse tear is made. And no one puts new wine into old wineskins; otherwise, the wine will burst the skins, and the wine is lost, and so are the skins; but one puts new wine into fresh wineskins."
